

Homework

One of the things that catches parents by surprise is that there is not a large amount of homework. The purpose of homework is to allow for students to practice the skills that are being taught in class. In the past I have had a 20 minute reading a night policy. However, I have switched to a different method. I know there are certain nights of the week that are busier for your family than other nights. Your student is required to read at least 120 minutes a week. It will be up to your student to manage his/her time during the week. Reading logs will go home every Friday. Completed logs are due the following Friday. I will let you know when we will begin the reading logs. In addition to the reading, your student will have an individualized math study plan that will need to be reviewed three-five times a day.

Rules

In my classroom, I do not have a list of rules. It is my belief that rules set the expectation that negative behavior is going to be an issue. Instead, we discuss what we need to do in this class to ensure that everyone is successful. Together we create a classroom charter. We identify 4-5 ways we want to feel in our classroom. Then we determine how that will be accomplished by creating we will statements. Once this is agreed upon a copy of our charter will be sent home.



Discipline

If an infraction of the class charter occurs I deal with it immediately. However, I do my best to not correct publicly. Discipline/correcting is not done to embarrass the student, but to correct a negative behavior and to show that actions have consequences. If the behavior continues there will be a loss of privileges, such as part of a recess. I will contact you by letter, e-mail, or a phone call if necessary. For only the serious problems will Mrs. Stefanich become involved. It is my goal that behavior never rises to that level.

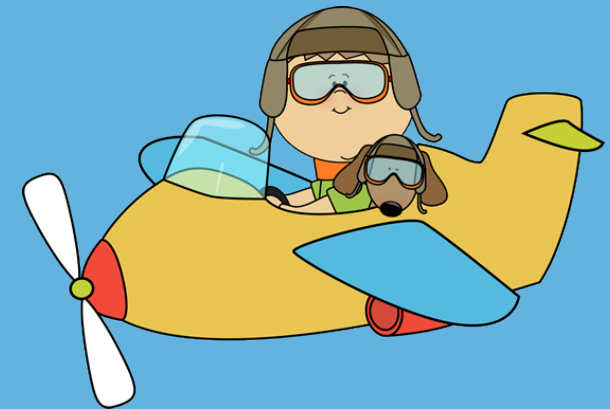
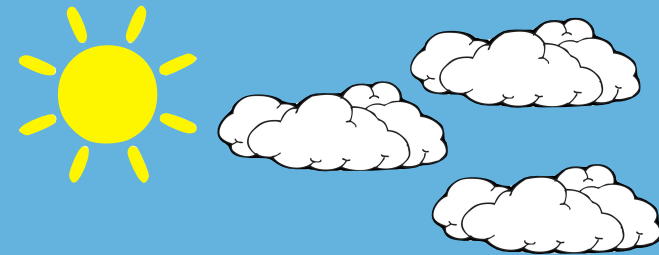
Communication

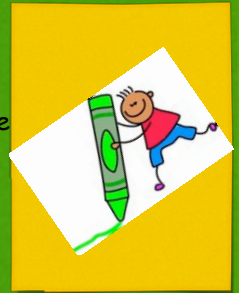
My Educational Beliefs
